What is Gift Aid?

Gift Aid is a government scheme which enables UK taxpayers to make tax-effective donations to the charity (or charities) of their choice. The charity can reclaim the basic tax you have paid on your donations.

What does it mean for me?

Any donations you make are worth 25p more per £1.00 to your parish, so you can give more to your parish at no extra cost to you for as long as your Declaration remains in place. There are no obligations or expectations regarding amount or frequency of your donations, and you don't have to be employed; if you pay tax on a pension, Capital Gains or any savings you can still Gift Aid. In addition, higher rate (40%) taxpayers can claim back the difference between the basic rate of tax and the tax they paid.

You can cancel your Declaration at any time and for any reason simply by letting us know.

What does it mean for my parish?

Your parish can reclaim 25p of tax for every £1.00 you donate, and the reclaimed amount goes directly to your parish. Although the basic rate of tax is 20%, the amount reclaimed is 25% because of the way the tax relief is calculated by HMRC (they say that for a basic rate taxpayer to give £1.00, they would have had to earn £1.25 and 20% of £1.25 is 25p). Across the Diocese, this equates to about £600,000 extra income per year for parishes.

How do I Gift Aid my donations to my parish?

All you need to do is complete a Gift Aid Declaration form, which you can obtain from your parish Gift Aid Organiser or on the reverse of this sheet. Hand the completed form to your Gift Aid Organiser, who will send it on to the Diocese for registration. Your donations will be eligible for Gift Aid from the beginning of the tax year in which your Declaration was signed.
