#### **Synodal Church**

Dear Sisters & Brothers; In order to grow as a Synodal Church it is important that we all have a chance to pray and discern how the Holy Spirit is inviting us to grow in Mission in our parishes and communities. To facilitate this, I together with others, offer an initial Diocesan vision for your prayerful reflection. Our discerned Diocesan commitments are: To Walk with Jesus and Enable Others to Encounter Him; To grow as One Diocesan Family - Rebuilding Relationships; Forming and Developing People for Mission; Living Justly and Caring for Our Common Home. Each of these commitments are developed in the vision. It is not my intention to impose this vision. It is offered for further reflection, and I invite all of our parishes and communities to prayerfully reflect on them. We offer accompanying resources and support to enable this reflection. #### Sunday Mass at St. Paul's

Dear parishioners, as you are aware the parish is struggling financially for its upkeep. The Sunday Mass congregation is averaging around 40 and the cost to run two Masses has been increasing what with the utility bills all going up quite a lot. The parish is finding it harder and harder to meet the increasing costs although we do appreciate that some parishioners have kindly increased their donations. However, the Parish Council in its last meeting on May 12,24 deliberated upon this matter and has come to a decision based on the consensus of all the members. The availability, capability, and resilience of our Parish Priest to maintain two Masses is no longer viable. To this end as of July, St Paul's Sunday Mass will cease, however we have the option for the Sunday Mass at St. John's, Annitsford. Currently Father's time is split between St John's and St Paul's on Sunday morning. There is very little time after the 9.30 Mass for him to spend with the parishioners of St John's before having to travel up to St Paul's for Mass. This change should help provide more time for that. We also feel that providing only one Mass will bring us closer together as a parish and closer with St. John's. It's been observed that often people attend the same Mass time every week and the opportunity to mix with everyone is not possible. As you know Fr. Stanly is a fulltime student. He often helps with Mass, but this was never part of his role, as during his full-time university work his priestly duties were suspended. As his final year of study approaches, and his workload increases, he will likely have less time to volunteer to celebrate Masses for us. I hope you all can agree that our Priests have heavy workloads and to protect their physical and mental wellbeing in our community, now and in the future, we must accept change as inevitable to maintain a working parish. It's also good to remember that both parishes have become closer since Fr. Manoj became Parish Priest over both and this has also been helped by The Partnership Masses, other activities and celebrations that have been held. Many of you already attend both locations regularly so we hope this change would happen smoothly and help our parish build resilience for the future and provide our Parish Priest with the ability to best manage both parishes and spend more time with the parishioners – TExtract from the Minutes of the last Parish Council Meeting.
