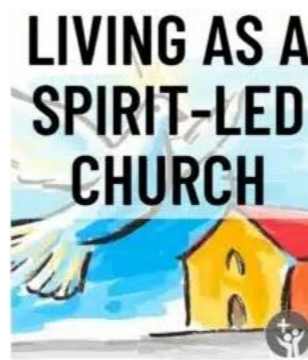

**Sixth Sunday of Easter [A]**

**Sacred Silence, Please**

*As you enter, we invite you to keep a spirit of quiet prayer. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed, and your silence helps everyone to pray more deeply. Thank you for your reverence.*

**Pope Leo XIV's message for May 2026:** That everyone might have food. Let us pray that everyone, from large producers to small consumers, be committed to avoid wasting food and to ensure that everyone has access to quality food.



### 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter – Living in the promise.

The 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter Year A reminds us that God's love is active and present in our lives. The readings show how faith spreads, how praise lifts our hearts, and how the Holy Spirit gives us strength. They encourage us to trust that God is with us in every moment. In Acts, we see the Gospel reaching new people and the Spirit moving among them. The psalm invites everyone to praise God for His mighty works. Peter calls us to speak of our hope with gentleness. In the Gospel, Jesus promises the Spirit will be with us forever. These passages are full of hope and promise. The 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter Year A points us to a God who draws close to His people. It shows us how faith grows when we live in love, speak with courage, and keep our eyes fixed on the Lord. The readings also remind us that God is always with His people. Faith, love,

and the Holy Spirit guide Christians in their daily lives and Jesus promises that the Holy Spirit will remain with His followers. The Holy Spirit is always at work in the world and in the Church. From creation to Pentecost and beyond, the Spirit gives life, strength, and guidance. He helps people grow in faith and love. He teaches that every person has value and should be treated with respect. The Holy Spirit continues to lead the Church today. He gives wisdom to believers and courage to live as followers of Jesus. He helps the Church teach truth and defend human dignity. The 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter Year A calls us to listen to the Spirit, trust in His guidance, and live with love and kindness.



### Pastoral Visit by Bishop Stephen Wright:

We are pleased to welcome Bishop Stephen Wright on his Pastoral Visit this weekend, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> May. He will be visiting St. Paul's Church, Cramlington on the evening of Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> May at 5.30pm when the Rosary will be recited prior to our 6:00pm Mass which will be presided over by Bishop Stephen. After Mass there will be Tea / Coffee and refreshments when parishioners will have the opportunity to meet and interact with Bishop Stephen.

On Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> May he will visit St. John the Baptist Church, Annitsford 9.00 AM when the Rosary will be recited prior to our 9:30am Mass which will be presided over by Bishop Stephen. We will have a Coffee Morning with the Bishop from 10:30am-11:15am giving parishioners an opportunity to meet and interact with Bishop Stephen. At 11:15am there will be a Joint Meeting with Parish Council members of both St. Paul's and St. John's. At 12noon the Bishop will be taken out for lunch. A pastoral visit is always a special time for us as a parish community to meet and spend time with our Bishop. It offers a valuable opportunity to share in fellowship, listen, and discuss any matters of concern or interest within our two parishes.

**"Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA):** We are looking for parishioners to join a group to support people who are looking to be received into Full Communion with the Catholic Church with a view to Easter 2027. Whether you are a cradle Catholic or were received later in life your experience will be invaluable as you journey with them. **IMPORTANT NOTICE:** The scattering of Ashes over an existing grave is not permitted in St John's Graveyard; they MUST be buried in a plot. The CORRECT procedure is to firstly, apply for permission to bury the ashes, then provide a copy of the Cremation Certificate as the Death MUST be recorded in the Parish Death Register and then, await written permission before arranging with the Parish approved Gravedigger to prepare the plot.

**New Extra-Ordinary Minister of Holy Communion Training:** This involves some input and opportunities to reflect upon our understanding of the gift of Holy Communion and the call to serve. Part of the programme allows future extraordinary ministers to practise in person essential aspects of this ministry and then be commissioned. Those who train to be new Extraordinary Ministers can follow one of two pathways: a) In person - gatherings of two evenings (2 hours each) and a day (4.5 hours including a lunch break). This will lead to a commissioning at the end of the day session. or b) a mixed programme of three online sessions (1.5 hours each and an "in person" day session (4.5 hours including a lunch break). **Lecture at Holy Name, Jesmond:** From Francis to Leo: the Catholic Church in a Change of Era' - When Pope Francis died a year ago, the Cardinals elected a Pope who would continue and deepen his reform, which they said was key to evangelizing today's world. This is what Francis and now Leo call "the change of era" -- a new apostolic age. In his lecture at the Holy Name Church, Jesmond, Newcastle upon Tyne NE2 3JX on Saturday 16 May at 11am, Pope Francis biographer and noted Catholic journalist and commentator, Dr Austen Ivereigh explains the nature of the Francis-Leo transition, how the Church is being called to change its way of operating, and why it matters for the future of faith in these islands.
