16th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year (A). Theme: Growth of God's Kingdom

The readings show how God gives people time to change and how His kingdom grows in unexpected ways focusing on God's patience and mercy in the growth of His kingdom. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus teaches through parables about God's kingdom. On the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A, we hear how good seed grows alongside weeds until the harvest. In Matthew 13:24-43, Jesus tells the parable of the weeds and the wheat. The farmer allows both to grow together until the harvest. Have you ever had trouble telling the difference between something good and something that only looks good? The mustard seed and yeast also show how something small can grow into something great. These images reveal the hidden but powerful work of God's kingdom.

Matthew often focuses on discipleship and the call to live according to God's kingdom. These parables fit into that larger message, teaching patience, trust, and hope. Even when evil appears present, God's plan is unfolding. The growth of the kingdom begins small but brings life to the world

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly:

will be celebrated this year next Sunday 26th July, the Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus with the theme "I will never forget you" chosen by Pope Leo. This worldwide celebration in the Universal Church shows

it is a momentous achievement being Grandparents and / or the Elderly. We hope it reassures them that they are loved and that they are needed. It reminds us that God's unwavering love is the ultimate answer to the isolation and neglect so often experienced by the elderly. It brings comfort and hope, assuring us that the Lord knows each of us personally, forgets no one, and loves us unconditionally, even through the frailties of old age. Since its creation in 2021, the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly has grown into a cherished tradition that teaches our communities to truly value the elderly, not through occasional gestures, but as a permanent, central part of our lives. This celebration helps us appreciate older generations as vital keepers of our history, witnesses to our faith, and teachers for our lives. This year, we want to place a special emphasis on closeness to others. We ask communities to reach out directly to those who live alone, are staying in care homes, or have no visitors. Let this Day be a tangible opportunity for everyone, especially young people, to spend time with their grandparents, the elderly in their families, and most importantly, those who are completely isolated. The World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly is a beautiful highlight, a privileged moment of the Church's broader ongoing pastoral care towards our older brothers and sisters, and is not designed to replace the continuous, rich pastoral life that must animate Christian communities throughout the year. The true spirit of the prophet's words comes alive in our ordinary daily routines — through weekly visits, patient listening, and shared prayer.
